

WEEKLY REPORT

Traffic:

- On March 15th, Lt. Aniunas and Sgt. Davis attended a meeting with Tom Coleman and Mark Deshon of Bike Newark to discuss a bike lane proposal on North College at West Main Street.
- During the week, the traffic unit will conduct stop sign enforcement in the Fairfield development following citizen complaints.
- On March 15th, the traffic unit assisted with patrol supplement for firearms qualifications.

Special Operations:

- On March 13th, Sgt. D'Elia and M/Cpl. Conover took over as the supervisor and assistant supervisor for the Special Operations Unit.
- On March 13th, Lt. Aniunas attended the City Council meeting to discuss the proposed Community Policing Center project.
- On March 15th, Lt. Aniunas, and Deputy Chief Farrall met with Andrew Haines and Josh Brechbuehl to discuss implementation of the Community Policing Center at 134 East Main Street.
- On March 15th, Sgt. D'Elia along with Code Enforcement and Delaware Alcohol and Tobacco Enforcement (DATE) visited area restaurants to review ordinances and restrictions in preparation for the upcoming St. Patrick's Day.
- On March 16th, Officer Taras Gerasimov will attend a meeting with the Bike Newark group.
- On Saturday, March 18th Mayor Sierer will conduct a ride along with the Special Operations Unit.

Patrol Division:

- Sgt. Jones and Lt. Nelson will be conducting interviews on 3/16 for officers interested in being firearm instructors.

Criminal Investigations Division:

- The Street Crimes Unit continues its proactive enforcement and arrested a female for prostitution at the Super 8 on E. Main Street. The defendant was also wanted out of South Carolina for fraud and was committed pending extradition.
- On Tuesday, 3/14/17, the Newark Police Department was called out to investigate a reported kidnapping/robbery at the Christina Mill Apartment Complex. Officers from University of Delaware Police Department, The New Castle County Police Department and the Delaware State Police Aviation Unit all responded to the scene. During interviews with the reporting female, Newark Detectives noticed that there were inconsistencies in the series of events reported. The Newark Police Department, through an extensive overnight investigation, has determined that this case has been falsely reported.
- Newark Detectives and Street Crimes Unit will be working order maintenance patrol during this St. Patrick's Day weekend.
